

- While there are similar apps on the market, most do not have great usability nor design. This app will be the go-to for people who want to achieve an **organized** capsule wardrobe.













Do you struggle packing your clothes?













## Competition 1: Goodreads App




### Pros:

## Competition 2: Cladwell App




### Pros:
